## UGANDA: USAID LOCAL PARTNER WAREHOUSING AND DISTRIBUTION HIV COMMODITIES

OCTOBER 2021 – SEPTEMBER 2026

Sustainable HIV commodity security for Uganda's PNFP Health Sector. Among the 1.4 million people Living with HIV (PLHIV) aged 15 to 64 who knew their status, 86 percent are on antiretroviral therapy (ART). The USG in Uganda directly supports the treatment of patients in the PFNP sector. This Activity is one of the PEPFAR initiatives to transition to local partners to establish sufficient capacity, capability, and durability of these local partners to ensure successful, long-term, local partner engagement and impact.

# ACTIVITIES



**Verify and confirm to USAID that the types and quantities of HIV commodities it intends to procure through its local procurement contractors are needed and will be consumed prior to expiry.**



**Store and distribute under appropriate standards and conditions the HIV commodities procured by USAID via its local procurement including:-**

- a) Antiretroviral (ARV) drugs
- b) Opportunistic Infection (OI), Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) drugs and commodities related to Voluntary Medical Male Circumcision (VMMC),
- c) HIV rapid test kits (HRTK); Determine, StatPak, S.D, Bioline, HIV/Syphilis DUO, Self-Test Recency;
- d) Commodities for testing and sample collection for Viral Load (VL) or Early Infant Diagnosis (EID); and
- e) Other Lab commodities (e.g CD4, CrAG needed for chemistries and hematology)



**Ensure that the HIV commodities are delivered on time and in full to the PNFP health facilities.**



**Provide technical assistance on stock and store management and ordering to specific facilities**

# ANTICIPATED RESULTS



This activity supports USAID's overall objectives of increasing sustainability and self-reliance through the strengthening of local partners. It contributes to "Key Elements of Systems Strengthened," and specifically to "Availability and Management of Quality Commodities Improved."



This activity ensures the cost-effective warehousing and distribution of critical HIV commodities for the PNFP sector necessary to achieve and maintain epidemic control of HIV.



Provision of quality data at warehouse and health facilities level will lead to Improved Quantification and supply planning for HIV commodities.



Strengthening the systems for warehouse management, traceability and accountability of HIV commodities at all levels will lead to Reliable storage & distribution of IDIQ procured commodities.



Providing on time and full delivery of required HIV commodities will lead to improved availability at the PNFP sites.



Provision of technical assistance will Improve capacity of PNFP facilities to manage HIV commodities.
